Course Overview:

Music B2 Basic Elements of Music covers the music notation system—how musicians show the sound of music on paper. This includes learning to read both pitch and rhythm; learning about rhythmic relationships (meter); and learning about pitch relationships (major/minor tonality, scales, triads and other chords, and harmonic function).

Student Learning Outcomes:

A successful student in this class (earning a grade of C or better) will learn enough about written music that he or she will be able to:

- 1) write any triad or seventh chord in root position in any key;
- 2) recognize (analyze) any diatonic chord in context in a given key; and
- 3) reflect upon the cultural significance of music and the music notation system.

Course Requirements:

- 1) Attendance is mandatory. Students absent more than 3 times may be dropped.
- 2) Students that are absent for any class meeting during the first two weeks of the class without notifying the instructor will be dropped.
- 3) All students are expected to check their campus email regularly. Most handouts will be distributed in this manner. Students must print their own copies.
- 4) There will be unscheduled in-class assignments that will count as much as a homework assignment. Students who miss such assignments may not make them up.
- 5) Homework is assigned almost every night. You are responsible for reading the syllabus and being aware of assignments and due dates. <u>Only complete and on-time assignments will receive credit.</u> <u>Late homework will not be accepted.</u>
